Guidelines for Authors

About the Journal:

"Journal of Homoeopathy" is a peer-reviewed journal published by the National Institute of Homoeopathy, an autonomous organization under the Ministry of Ayush, Government of India. The "Journal of Homoeopathy" is designed to publishing on authentic research work on the advancement in fundamental and applied aspects of Homoeopathy and is published for the professionals having common interest in this field Nationally and Internationally. Articles/ Manuscripts from the National and International authors, Medical faculties, Researchers are invited to submit their work for publication in this journal.

Theme: The Journal publishes theoretical articles of original work, case study, case series, research work, review article, book review, archive article, survey study etc.

Authors should adhere to the following guidelines when submitting articles:

Title: The title must be relevant, concise, informative reflecting the central theme of the article.

Abstract: A concise and factual abstract is required. The abstract should state briefly the purpose of the research/study, the methods, the principal results and major conclusions. A structured abstract is required for original article and the format should consist of four sections, labelled "Background", "Methods", "Results" and "Conclusions". Citing references and non-standard or uncommon abbreviations should be avoided. The length should be less than 250 words for Review and Original article, less than 100 words for Case report.

Keywords: Immediately after the abstract, provide a maximum of 6, but at least 4, keywords, avoiding general and plural terms and multiple concepts (e.g. avoid, for example, "and", "of"). Only abbreviations firmly established in the field of your study may be considered.

Abbreviations: Define abbreviations that are not standard in this field in a footnote to be placed on the first page of the article. Such abbreviations that are unavoidable in the abstract must be defined at their first mention as well as in the footnote. Ensure consistency of abbreviations throughout the article.

Review article: The length of the article will be limited within 5,000 words including tables and figures. Abstract should be less than 250 words.

Original article: The length of the article will be within 4,000 words excluding tables and figures; tables and figures should be within 8 combined and references are to be within 50. Abstract should not exceed 250 words.

Case report: Case reports will be welcome; however, a report with not a single but several cases is recommended. Case report should not exceed 1500 words including tables and figures; tables and figures should be within 3 combined; references should be within 20. Abstract should be within 100 words.

Authorship: All authors should have made substantial contributions to all of the following:

- (1) The conception and design of the study, or acquisition of data, or analysis and interpretation of data.
- (2) Drafting the article or revising it critically for important intellectual content.
- (3) Final approval of the version to be submitted.
- (4) Agreement to be accountable for all aspects of the work in ensuring that questions related to the accuracy or integrity of any part of the work are appropriately investigated and resolved.

Name of Author and affiliations: Please indicate the correct name. Present the author's affiliation addresses (where the actual work was done) below the names. Indicate all affiliations with a lower-case superscript letter immediately after the author's name and in front of the appropriate address. Provide the full postal address of each affiliation, including the e-mail address.

Corresponding author: Clearly indicate with whom the correspondence will be made at all stages of referring and publication, also post-publication. Ensure that telephone and fax numbers (with country and area code) are provided in addition to the e-mail address and the complete postal address. Contact details must be kept up to date by the corresponding author.

Article structure:

Manuscript: All submissions should include the following:

(1) Title page, (2) Abstract (3) Keywords, (4) Main text, (5) Endnotes, (6) Acknowledgements, (7) References, (8) Tables, and (9) Figures. All pages must be typed in MS WORD and 1.5 spaced (including notes and references) using 12-point Times New Roman font in A4 size paper on one side. Please use one-inch margin on all sides. Each table and figure should be on a separate page. It is the responsibility of authors to submit manuscripts in the proper format. Manuscripts not submitted in proper format will be returned for revision.

Font Size: The font size may be maintained as follows for easy identification: Title: 16 font size (Bold). Main Heading: 14 font size (Bold); Sub-Heading: 12 font size (Bold); Next-sub-Heading: 12 font size (Italics); Next-sub-Heading: 12 font size (Ordinary).

Subdivision- numbered sections: Divide the article into clearly defined and numbered sections. Subsections may be numbered as 1.1 (then 1.1.1, 1.1.2, ...), 1.2, etc. (exclude section numbering in the abstract). Use this numbering also for internal cross-reference. Any subsection may be given a brief heading. Each heading should appear in separate line.

Language: All the documents must be written in English, using correct diction, syntax, and grammar. Indian English standards for spelling and punctuation are preferred. Any manuscript that does not meet the level of English proficiency consistent with English-language journals will be rejected.

Introduction: State the objectives of the work and provide an adequate background, avoiding a detailed literature survey or a summary of the results.

Material and methods: Provide sufficient detail to allow the work to be reproduced. Methods already published should be indicated by a reference: only relevant modifications should be described.

Results: Results should be clear and concise.

Discussion: This should explore the significance of the result of the work. A combined result and discussion section is often appropriate. Avoid extensive citations and discussion of published literature.

Conclusion: Should be presented with clarity and precision. The result should be written in the past tense

when describing the findings of the author's experiments. Previously published findings should be written in present tense. The result should be explained, but largely without referring to the literature. Discussion, speculation and detailed interpretation of data should not be included in conclusion but the brief essence of the same may be presented.

Guidelines in general:

- The Manuscript which has not been published or have not been submitted to any other journal for publication will be accepted.
- For publication of project work, survey study, multicentric study etc. is to be submitted through proper channel with due permission and acknowledgement from the concerned organization.
- There will be a separate cover page for each submission mentioning details about the title of the work, author's details or details of investigators, details about guide (if any), date of submission, details about Organization or Institute where the experiment or study was done. One Author should be designated as corresponding Author. His/her Email address, Full postal address, Telephone number etc. should be mentioned here.
- Name of the Principal Investigator or Main author will be mentioned first followed by the name of other authors separating them with coma. Designation of each author will be mentioned at the bottom of the cover page which must be clearly identifiable.
- The name of the author(s) or investigator(s) should not be mentioned or reflected anywhere other than the cover page. If author's name is identified within the text or in any page other than cover page during any stage of reviewing process, the article will be rejected and will not be considered for publication (if selected).
- The title of the article/study should appear on the second page before starting the main text of the article
- Legal Requirements: Submission of a manuscript implies that (1) the work described has not been published before (except in the form of a conference abstract or as part of a published lecture or thesis for an academic qualification), (2) the work is not under consideration for publication elsewhere, (3) it's publication has been approved by all co-authors, if any, as well as by the responsible authorities at the

institute where the work has been carried out. The publisher will not be held legally responsible for any claims of compensation.

- Evaluation: Mere submission of the article does not guarantee it's publication. Each article submitted will be scrutinized by Editorial board and Review committee. Suggestions, modifications if any, recommended by the committee will be communicated to the author. The Editorial Board reserves the right of non-acceptance of any article without assigning any reason whatsoever.
- Copyright transfer: After the acceptance of the article for publication in "Journal of Homoeopathy", the author will be asked to transfer Copyright (publication and dissemination rights) of the article to the Publisher under Copyright laws.
- Communication: The author needs to submit a declaration mentioning, the article is an original work done by him and/or his/her associates/team members. A short note about author's details e.g., Name, Designation, Qualification, Corresponding address, E-mail id, Mobile number etc. must be sent along with the declaration.
- Plagiarism: Unauthorized, illegal reproduction of information from any other article, as if author's own work is strictly to be avoided and consequences arising from such act are exclusively of author's responsibility which will be considered as the act of plagiarism. Standard plagiarism rules will be applied.

Acknowledgements: Collate acknowledgements (if any) in a separate section at the end of the article before the references are given. List the names of those individuals who assisted during the research (e.g., providing language assisted, writing assistance or proof reading the article, etc.). The names of the funding organizations should be written in full.

Footnotes: Footnotes should be used sparingly. Number them consecutively throughout the article, using superscript Arabic numbers. Indicate the position of footnotes in the text and present the footnotes separately at the end of the article. Do not include footnotes in the reference list. Table footnotes indicate each footnote in a table with a superscript lowercase letter.

Figure captions: Each illustration should have a caption, not to be attached to the figure, should be placed separately and should be denoted by lowercase letters. Insert a note in the text to indicate placement (e.g., "Figure

1 about here"). Caption should comprise a brief title (not on the figure itself) and a description of the illustration to a minimum text. Do not use abbreviations within figures. Identify any previously published material by giving the original source in the form of a reference at the end of the caption. Identity of persons or patients in the from of photos is strictly prohibited and should not be disclosed in anyway. The author(s) is responsible for securing permission to reproduce all copyrighted figures, photos or materials before their publication. A copy of the written permission from the copyright owner must be included with the manuscript submission.

Tables: The tables will be numbered consecutively in accordance with their appearance in the text. Place footnotes to tables below the table body and indicate them with superscript lowercase letters. Insert a note in the text to indicate the placement (e.g., "Table1 about here"). Make sure that the data presented in tables do not duplicate results described elsewhere in the article. Number of tables should be kept minimum and should be simple. The table should be self-explanatory. Type each table on a separate page. Do not use abbreviations within tables. Each table must include a descriptive title and headings for columns and rows. Use asterisks *, **, and *** to indicate significance. Identify any previously published material by giving the original source in the form of a reference at the end of the table heading.

REFERENCES

It is the author's responsibility to make sure that all the information provided in the reference section is complete and correct. Maintain VANCOUVER style to write references. Numbering of references to be maintained properly which needs to be reflected in the text of the article and will be indicated by superscripts lower-case letters.

Citation in text: Please ensure that every reference cited in the text is also present in the reference list (and vice versa). Any references cited in the abstract must be given in full. Unpublished results and personal communications are not recommended for citation in the text and in the reference list as well.

Web references: At the minimum, the full URL should be given and the date when the reference was last accessed. Any further information, if known (DOI, names of author, dates, reference to the source publication, etc.), should also be given.

Reference style in the text: Indicate references by number(s) in square brackets in line with the text. The

actual authors can be referred to, but the reference number(s) must always be given. In the reference list: number the references (numbers in square brackets as mentioned in the text) in the order in which they appear in the text.

Proofs: One set of page proofs will be sent by e-mail to the corresponding author or, a link will be provided in the e-mail so that authors can download the files themselves. Please use this proof only for checking the typesetting, editing, completeness and correctness of the text, tables and figures. Significant changes to the article as accepted for publication will only be considered at this stage with permission from the Editor. We will do everything possible to get your article published quickly and accurately. Therefore, it is important to ensure that all of your corrections are sent back to us in one communication. Please check carefully before replying, as inclusion of any subsequent corrections cannot be accepted. Proofreading is solely the responsibility of the authors.

Submission declaration: Submission of an article implies that the work described has not been published previously (except in the form of an abstract or as part of a published lecture or academic thesis), that it is not under consideration for publication elsewhere, that it's publication is approved by all authors and tacitly or explicitly by the responsible authorities where the work was carried out, and that, if accepted, it will not be published elsewhere including electronically in the same form, in English or in any other language, without the written consent of the copyright-holder.

Conflict of Interest: All authors must disclose any financial and personal relationships with other people or organizations that could inappropriately influence (bias) their work. Examples of potential conflicts of interest include employment, consultancies, stock ownership, honoraria, paid expert testimony, patent applications/ registrations, and grants or other funding. Any conflicts of interest must be disclosed at the end of the submitted manuscript under the sub-heading 'Conflict of interest statement'. If there are no conflicts of interest then please state, 'Conflicts of interest: None'.

Copyright: Upon acceptance of an article, authors will be asked to complete a 'Journal Publishing Agreement'. An email will be sent to the corresponding author confirming receipt of the manuscript together with a 'Journal Publishing Agreement' form. The journal is exclusively imposing Indian and International copyright @National

Institute of Homoeopathy. Prior permission is necessary to reproduce or to quote any part of the articles, including compilations and translations. For getting permission, request may be sent to the following e-mail address journalofhomoeopathy@gmail.com.
